Note the rocks in the foreground which have been excavated to create the trench beds. The full group comprises 12 women who have obtained 1 200 m² land at Mzamomhle Primary School. These women, plus two other groups, are now beginning to market their organic vegetables to retailers outside the townships. In November, we began testing the market - in 40 hours over 11 days, over R1 200 worth of produce was sold outside the townships. We now have a starter list of organic produce retailers who will guarantee good prices if the groups can provide a reliable supply. The market test sold only a fraction of total crops for the season, valued at over R10 000. Vegetables not sold are currently mostly consumed or sold to neighbours at home. Any losses are recycled as fertiliser. Organic vegetables are increasingly in demand in South Africa. In the year 2000 we intend to establish permanent production contracts which will yield the first ever micro-ecological gardening jobs in the townships of South Africa.

ABALIMI was presented with this medal - and a certificate which now hangs in our Khayelitsha office - on the 5th November. ABALIMI is one of seven Medal Winners in the prestigious CAPE TIMES-MTN-Institute of Architects Centenary Conservation & Environment Awards. This is one of the oldest awards in South Africa - since 1976.



This is the seventh National Conservation & Environment Award that ABALIMI and its projects have been given since 1992. The others are:

- The Green Trust Awards 1992 & 1995;
- The President's Social Forestry Awards 1995 & 1996;
- The Conserva Awards 1995; and
- The Peace Gardens Awards 1994.

ARBOUR WEEK 1999

saw 1715 trees distributed and planted through ABALIMI at 27 schools, 640 homes and at the Manyanani Peace Park.

TOTAL SA gave three x R5 000 greening awards to three schools in Delft. ABALIMI has been appointed by TOTAL SA to ensure that these three schools plant their new gardens sustainably and in a water-wise manner.

project is now underway!

This is an important community conservation, urban farming and job creation project launched by the Homeless People's Federation with the support of ABALIMI. We have a very special young man - Brett Young - managing this project on a voluntary basis until it gets on its feet. The photographs show (1) the beautiful Peace Lilies which will be on sale next year, (2) the Rhizome lifting team rescuing endangered stock from a soon-to-be building site, (3) sorting over 20 000 Rhizomes for planting, (4) preparing the land and (5) planting. A minimum of four informal permanent jobs and 20 seasonal jobs will be created next year once the project hits the streets. We are looking for a donor or donors to invest R300 000,00 next year - once off - and come in as a development partner in this unique urban ecological micro-farming project which will be another leading community-based model for South Africa.
